

## SHOW US YOU'RE FLY - LIST OF FLIES FOR 2009

### JANUARY:

Damsel Nymph (Rumpf)  
 (Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 112)  
 HOOK: Kamasan B820 or Tiemco 947BL, # 12  
 TREAD: Olive  
 TAIL: Dyed olive green partridge  
 RIB: Copper wire  
 BODY: Blend of Lazerlights and Lite Brite dubbings  
 THORAX: As for body with strands picked out to simulate legs  
 WING-CASE: Dyed olive pheasant tail  
 EYES: Spirit River, small black  
 Material colours can be varied from light green through to dark olive depending on light conditions and environment.

### FEBRUARY:

Green Biot  
 (Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 25)  
 HOOK: Kamasan B440, B405, #12-18  
 TREAD: Uni-Thread 8/0, dark brown  
 TAILS: Dark brown/red cock hackle fibres  
 BODY: Goose biot dyed olive green, tied with each turn side by side, so as to expose the fine herl to form the ribbing on the body  
 HACKLE: Hoffman furnace (darkish) or coch-y-bonddu

### MARCH:

Spent Red Spinner  
 (Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 49)  
 HOOK: Kamasan B401, # 14-16  
 TREAD: Pre-waxed, black  
 TAIL: Microfibetts (light dun)  
 BODY: Polypropylene yarn (orange & black)  
 RIB: Silver wire (fine)  
 WING: Poly yarn (grey)  
 THORAX: Black rabbit fur  
 HACKLE: Sandy dun – clipped on the bottom enabling the outstretched (spent) wings to lie flush on the water film

### APRIL:

Little Pine Dun  
 (Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 60)  
 HOOK: Mustard Special Limerick 9578B, # 10-12  
 TREAD: Uni-Thread 8/0, dark green  
 TAIL: Furnace brown fibres  
 BODY: Green silk  
 WING: Blackbird wing  
 HACKLE: Hoffman furnace brown

### MAY:

Baited Breath  
 (Somewhere on the internet)  
 HOOK: Size 2-6 light saltwater  
 TREAD: Clear mono  
 EYES: Bead chain eyes  
 WEIGHT: Lead wire if required  
 MOUTH PARTS: Small bunch of marabou, rabbit fur or polar fibre  
 SIEVES: A couple of strands of pearl flash topped with a few strands of super hair  
 LEGS: Hen hackle  
 BODY: Translucent dubbing



**JUNE:**

Possum & Peacock Nymph  
(Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 88)  
HOOK: Mustard 9672, # 10-16  
TREAD: Black  
TAIL: Black hackle fibres  
BODY: Black possum tail  
RIB: Medium gold wire  
THORAX: Peacock herl  
THROAT: Red rosella

**JULY:**

Bloody Mary  
(Australia's Best Trout Flies Page 97)  
HOOK: Kamasan B175, # 8-10  
TREAD: Uni-Thread 6/0, black  
TAIL: Antron, red  
BODY: Red Lurex  
RIB: Gold wire  
HACKLE: Black cock (poor quality)

**AUGUST:**

Wigram's Robin  
(Australia's Best Trout Flies - Page 105)  
HOOK: Kamasan B # 8-10  
TREAD: Momocord 6/0, black  
RIB: Gold embossed tinsel  
BUTT: Pink fluorescent wool – one third of the hook shank  
BODY: Remainder, black seal's fur  
WING: Strip of black fur, tied matuka style  
CHEEKS: Jungle cock  
Unlike other matuka patterns the ribbing commences after the fluoro butt and not along the entire shank length. The traditional pattern has a wing of four black hen feathers

**SEPTEMBER:**

Split Partridge  
(The Complete Guide to New Zealand Trout Lures – Page 58 & 200)  
HOOK: 2-8  
TAIL: Yellow hackle fibres  
BODY: Orange chenille  
RIB: Oval silver tinsel  
WING: Split partridge tail  
HEAD: Black

*Tie in the tail whisks. Tie in the chenille and the ribbing.  
Wind on the chenille back nearly to the head. Split a partridge tail feather in half down the spine. This provides two matching sides which are then tied in at the butt. Wind on the ribbing, tying down the wing (Matuka Style) to the top of the body. Tie in the hackle feather, and wind on to form the hackle collar.*



**OCTOBER:**

Black Marabou Muddler  
(Ian Brideson's Variation)  
HOOK: 6 - 8  
TREAD: Black & Red  
TAIL: Red hackle fibres  
BODY: Silver Mylar tube  
WING: Black Marabou,  
SIDE STRIPS: Two strands of peacock herl tied in on each side  
HEAD: Natural deer hair spun and clipped to form the muddler head  
Hint: Tie in tail and rear of mylar tube with red thread, after that use black



**NOVEMBER:**

Adam Black Cicada

(Australian Fly Patterns - Page 135)

HOOK: Tiemco 200R, size 8-12

TREAD: Black Uni-Thread 6/0

BODY: Spun and clipped black deer hair

WING: Folded white raffia x 2

HEAD: Spun black mink

This is a good fly for the Goulburn River, Victoria, in years when cicadas emerge.



**DECEMBER:**

Crazy Charlie

(Somewhere on the internet)

HOOK: Standard Stainless Saltwater, size 2-8

TREAD: White, 3/0

Tail: Pearl Krystal Flash (Optional)

BODY: Clear vinyl tubing

WING: White hackle (2 or 4), tied convex sides together, and a few strands of pearl Krystal Flash
